Show a list of incidents reported by a user from an on-premise or cloud system (E): This scenario requires integrating data from another SAP or third-party system (the incident management system) into SAP Build Work Zone, advanced edition. [This can be achieved by developing an extension that uses the SAP Build Work Zone, advanced edition APIs to fetch and display the relevant data in a card or a widget on a workpage](#)³⁴.

The scenarios that could not be implemented with extensions for SAP Build Work Zone, advanced edition are:

Ensure single-sign-on experience for all users (A): This scenario does not require developing an extension, as SAP Build Work Zone, advanced edition already supports single-sign-on (SSO) for all users. SSO can be configured by the administrator using the SAP Cloud Platform Identity Authentication service.

Create a new link to corporate policies in the user menu ©: This scenario does not require developing an extension, as SAP Build Work Zone, advanced edition already allows adding custom links to the user menu. This can be done by the administrator using the SAP Build Work Zone, advanced edition UI.

The SAP Build Work Zone mobile app passcode policy can be configured in the SAP BTP subaccount mobile service. This is the SAP Mobile Services instance that is used by the SAP Mobile Start app as an https endpoint for authentication and routing. It provides an Admin Cockpit that allows administrators to access logs and configure specific settings for the app, such as the passcode policy. The passcode policy determines the minimum length, complexity, and expiration time of the passcode that users must create to access the app. By default, the passcode should have a minimum length of 8 digits/characters and it is possible to allow biometric authentication (for example, face ID, fingerprint) upon successful passcode creation. To access the SAP BTP subaccount mobile service, administrators need to have the MobileAdmin role assigned to them and construct the URL for the SAP Mobile Services Admin Cockpit. Reference:

The workspace administrator role collection enables users to manage a specific workspace, such as creating areas, assigning area administrators, and configuring workspace settings. The sub-workspace administrator and area administrator types do not require a role collection assignment, as they are created and managed within the SAP Build Work Zone content manager by the workspace administrator or the area administrator respectively.
